

Comparison of Karnataka CET (Medical) and NEET

As per the Supreme Court ruling dated 9th May 2016, NEET replaces all other entrance examinations for admission to undergraduate Medical and Dental courses.

The table below compares Karnataka CET (Medical) and NEET examinations:

Scoring Pattern	One mark for each MCQ. No negative marking.	Four marks for each MCQ. One mark deducted for each wrong answer.
Syllabus Weightage	Approximately 25% of questions from I PU syllabus and rest from II PU syllabus Hence, more emphasis on II PU syllabus	Approximately 50% questions from I PU & 50% questions from II year syllabus Hence equal emphasis on both I & II year syllabi
